Xinyu Culture and Sports Complex, Xinyu

TSH led the master planning and design submission for this new culture and sports centre in the City of Xinyu.

Our park concept integrated passive open space within an extension of the urban street grid. The large stadium and public facilities were concentrated along the major transit arterials, creating a dynamic street address for the spectator venues. The quiet children's parkette and contemplative gardens were adjacent to future residential and city hall precincts, placed within sweeping lawns and forests. Symbolic tributaries of the Kongmu River meander though our park introducing water running, splashing and cascading from buildings, fountains and canals.
